

Cookies Policy

This Cookies Policy explains what Cookies are and how We use them. You should read this policy so You can understand what type of cookies We use, or the information We collect using Cookies and how that information is used.

In this policy we use the term “cookies” to refer to cookies and other similar technologies covered by all applicable laws on privacy in electronic communications.

Most Internet browsers support cookies; however, users can set their browsers to decline certain types of cookies or specific cookies. Further, users can delete cookies at any time. We do not store sensitive personal information, such as mailing addresses, account passwords, etc. in the Cookies We use.

Cookies do not typically contain any information that personally identifies a user, but personal information that we store about You may be linked to the information stored in and obtained from Cookies. For further information on how We use, store and keep your personal data secure, see our Privacy Policy.

There are different types of cookies, and they can be distinguished on the basis of their origin, function and lifespan. Important characteristics of cookies include the following:

- First party cookies are cookies that are placed by the Web site you are visiting, while third party cookies are placed by a Web site other than the one you are visiting. Please note that we do not control the collection or further use of data by third parties.
- Necessary cookies are necessary to allow the technical operation of a Web site (e.g., they enable you to move around on a Web site and to use its features).
- Performance cookies collect data on the performance of a Web site such as the number of visitors, the time spent on the Web site and error messages.
- Functionality cookies increase the usability of a Web site by remembering your choices (e.g., language, region, login, and so on).
- Targeting/advertising cookies enable a Web site to send you personalized advertising.
- Session cookies are temporary cookies that are erased once you close your browser while persistent or permanent cookies stay on your device until you manually delete them or until your browser deletes them based on the duration period specified in the persistent cookie file.
